



Mr. Hans Herbert Teichmann

March 5, 1926 - April 20, 2014

Hans Herbert Teichmann, 88, passed away Easter Sunday, April 20, 2014, at his home in Duncan. Mr. Teichmann was the husband of Sharlene Teichmann, who was by his side at the time.

He was born in Chicago in 1926, son of the late Erwin and Dorothea Mueller Teichmann. He was in the Army Air Corp in Europe in World War II, flying the famed P-38 Lightning. After the war, he established a photography studio in Pasadena, with clients in the modeling and movie businesses.

Mr. Teichmann received an engineering degree from California Institute of Technology and launched into a varied career in structural engineering with firms manufacturing material handling, and valves and gauges for the petroleum industry. In the latter position, he traveled widely to countries using their products, often accompanied by his wife.

Mr. and Mrs. Teichmann loved travel and cruised extensively in many parts of the world. His favorite cruises were on the Winddstar ships, echoing his sailing days on his own sailboat.

After retirement, the Teichmanns moved to Nashville and Mr. Teichmann, to keep occupied, started another job as a facilities engineer for The Legends Golf Club. In 2004, they moved to the Spartanburg area, where Sharlene continues her career as a travel agent.

Hans was a lifelong lover of animals, with his favorite friend Peanut a constant companion for most of his recent years.

He built a large collection of tools and spare parts and was adept at fixing

things.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by two sons, Kenneth and Martin Teichmann and Jeffrey Platt in California, and Kelly Platt in Lyman. He is predeceased by his twin sister, Hannelore.

A memorial service is scheduled for Thursday, April 24, 11:30 a.m., at Joy Lutheran Church, 3980 Moore-Duncan Highway, Moore, SC, 29369. There will be a light lunch following at the Teichmann home.
