Moore, SC – James “Tony” Cantrell, 75, passed away after a long and courageous battle with cancer. He was the son of the late Fred A. and Iva Belle Taylor Cantrell and the loving husband of 54 years to Susan Heatherly Cantrell.

Born in Simpsonville, South Carolina, Tony lived a life marked by dedication, strength, and deep love for his family. He proudly served his country in the United States Army during the Vietnam War as a member of the 101st Airborne Division.
