Wellford: Paul Edmonds, 87 of Wellford, went to meet His Savior Tuesday, January 2, 2018 at his home. Born April 9th, 1930 in Greenville County, he was the son of Virgil and Hattie Mae Bowers Edmonds.

Mr. Edmonds was a sniper during the Korean War and worked in the Cloth Room of Jackson Mill for 32 years until retirement. A member of LifeSong Church, across the years he served His Lord in a variety of ways including being a Deacon at Jackson Mill Baptist and later at Calvary Baptist (now LifeSong). For many years he raced cars on the local racetracks as well as enjoying fishing and hunting in his spare time.

Mr. Edmonds is survived by his wife of 62 years Shirley Bishop Edmonds; sons Richard and Ronnie, both of the home; daughters Ava Gail Brown (Shannon) of Gray Court, and Judy of Wellford; one grandson Drew Brown of Chicago; sister April Condrey (Tommy); brothers JC, Fred, Mack (Louise) Edmonds; sister-in-law Thelma Edmonds; and numerous loving nieces and nephews.
