Terry Lee Anderson, 64, passed away peacefully at his residence on October 1, 2024. Born in Danville, Virginia, he was the son of the late Robert Evans Anderson, Jr. and the late Betty Testerman Voigt (Bobby).

Terry served proudly in the U.S. Army Airborne Forces and attended Coastal Carolina University. A talented artist, he devoted much of his career to commercial art, advertising, and design. He had a passion for collecting stamps, listening to classic blues, and was a lifelong student of art and music.
